Commissioner Pearl moved, Commissioner Senney seconded, to authorize the March 2025 financial and investment activity. Commissioners Pearl, Riley and Senney: ayes, motion carried.



VI. BUSINESS

A. Purchase Order Approval

The playground surface at Robert F. Mays (2016) and Iron Horse Parks (2017) consists of a rubber tile manufactured by SofSurfaces Inc. The SoftSurface's tile was selected as the best surfacing at the time based on safety, cost, durability, and warranty. The tile has provided a resilient surface since installation. However, it has begun to show signs of premature wear and surface settling that could lead to a tripping hazard. The manufacturer's 10-year limited warranty covers both of these issues. A warranty request was submitted to MidStates Recreation Inc., the installer of the playground structures, including the tile surfaces at both parks. After a thorough evaluation, and based on the age of the tiles, current condition, and surface wear, a settlement agreement was reached by all parties to replace 100% of the tiles at both parks. MidStates Recreation Inc. paid the park district \$75,000 in 2024 for the project to serve as payment for their responsibility of the warranty statement. SofSurfaces Inc. agreed to provide the tiles at a prorated cost and cover all labor for demolishing the old and installing the new surface. This leaves \$50,000 as the Park District's responsibility for the total project cost. The 2025 approved budget included \$125,000 to replace the rubber playground tiles at Iron Horse Park and Robert F. Mays Park. This total includes the \$75,000 previously paid by MidStates Recreation Inc.

Commissioner Senney moved, Commissioner Riley seconded, to authorize the purchase order for \$125,000 to SofSurfaces Inc. for the purchase and installation of playground tiles for Iron Horse and Robert F. Mays Park. Commissioners Pearl, Riley and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

- Commissioner Senney
 - It would be great to work with Bike Centerville to achieve more of a transportationfriendly community
- Commissioner Pearl
 - Inquired again as to whether the plaque on the rock at Activity Center Park can be polished. Staff has tried several methods to clean it up as much as possible. The material itself is meant to wear and look as it does.
 - Saw a photo challenge called the "Happiest outside photo challenge" sponsored by Dick's Sporting Goods, in conjunction with the Trust for Public Lands
 - Inquired as to where public meeting minutes are stored for safekeeping
 - Thank you to Commissioner Riley! Commissioner Pearl has appreciated his perspective over the years and it has been a pleasure working with him.
- Commissioner Riley
 - Reminder that increased shade should not only be considered for those playing, when installed, but for those accompanying/supervising those playing
 - National Access Board is holding a meeting in may focused on indoor tactile displays.
 This Board includes representatives from several entities including the National Park Service and the Smithsonian
